Nature of Support 2018 / 2019

Quality first teaching includes:

- Accelerated Reading Scheme
- Handwriting specialist working in school
- CPG scheme for Grammar

The funding from pupil premium has been allocated in the following ways:
 Learning supported by staff employed to deliver: -

- Individual discussions to identify barriers to learning, e.g. EAL, Speech and Language, home circumstances, attendance, medical.
- 1:1 Teaching.
- Small group focused work.
- Intervention to support reading (Accelerated Reader, Comprehension, CPG), maths (First Class Number, Collin's Busy Ant Maths) and writing.
- Focused intervention for phonics (Read, Write, Inc.).
- Focused support to develop personal, social and emotional skills (A Tummy Full of Fireworks, Social and Emotional Fix).
- Work to develop speech and language, following advice from Speech and Language therapist.
- Mentor Link – individual support for emotional development.
- Meet and greet sessions at the beginning of the school day.

Financial support for parents including remissions for: trips/ residential trips/ uniform.

Breakdown of spend of Pupil Premium in 2018/2019

£29,018 Staffing – Funding 1.5 Higher Level Teaching Assistants.
 £436 Allocated for parents to use for trips, School Uniform, milk. £100 per child.
 £670 Outside agencies.

Total spend: £30,124

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2018/2019

Due to the small number of children who have Pupil Premium Grant, the support for learners follows the needs of the individual children. Priority is given to specific needs in Literacy, with a focus on reading and spelling, and in maths, with a focus on Number. Additional focus on Social and Emotional development, where this is a barrier to learning.

Measuring the impact of PPG spend July 2019

- Year R – No children with PPG
- Year 1 – 1 child. Passed Year 1 phonics screening.
- Year 2 – 4 children
 - 3 achieved National expectations in Maths and reading, 1 at greater depth in Maths, 1 at greater depth in reading.
 - 2 achieved National expectations in writing.
 - 1 child high level needs (Education, Health and Care plan)
- Year 6 – No children with PPG
